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About This Report

The information in this report has been sourced by the National Centre for Pastoral Research from the Australian Census, which is carried out every five years by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS). Each Census year, the Centre obtains customised data on the Catholic population in Australia as part of the National Catholic Census Project (1991-2016). This data applies to all those who identify themselves as Catholic in the Census. The information is used to produce *Social Profiles* for every Catholic parish and diocese in the country, alongside a national profile. These are freely available for download from the NCPR website.

The information related to disability is included in the data received from the ABS. Two main variables have been used to produce the tables and charts in this report — 'Core Activity Need for Assistance' and 'Provision of Unpaid Assistance to a Person with a Disability'. Comparative tables of these variables for all dioceses are provided. Most of the data comes from the 2016 Census, but some comparisons are provided with 2011 and earlier years.

A section of the report also includes information on Sign languages. This data is collected within the Language question in the Census and is derived from those who indicated that they spoke a language other than English at home.

The *Diocesan Social Profiles* contain detailed information related to disability on page 12 of each report. These pages have been reproduced here for ease of access and are included as appendices at the end of the report.

Need for Assistance with Core Activities

The 2006 Census was the first to include the variable 'Core Activity Need for Assistance'. The variable was developed to measure the number of people with a profound or severe disability. The ABS defines the profound or severe disability population as: "those people needing help or assistance in one or more of the three core activity areas of self-care, mobility and communication, because of a long-term health condition (lasting six months or more), a disability (lasting six months or more), or old age". Most people who need assistance with core activities live either in a family or in a place such as a nursing home, where the care they need is provided. But many live alone. Often people with a disability have fewer opportunities for social interaction.²




Figure 1. Catholics who need assistance with core activities 2006-2016 and All persons 2016

Figure 1 shows the percentage of Catholics in Australia with a severe or profound disability in 2006, 2011 and 2016, as well as a comparison to all Australians in 2016. The proportion of Catholics who needed assistance rose from 4.3 per cent in 2006 to 5.8 per cent in 2016. This means, that in 2016, around 305,800 Catholics were disabled to the extent that they required assistance with some core activities.

Table 1 shows the number of Catholics needing assistance with core activities in every diocese for each Census from 2006 to 2016. The Archdiocese of Melbourne recorded the highest number of Catholics (66,436) in this category in 2016. Significant high numbers were also seen in Archdiocese of Brisbane (39,635) and Sydney (36,027).

Proportionately, the Diocese of Lismore had the highest percentage (7.3%) of all dioceses with Catholics who had a severe or profound disability in 2016, followed by the Archdioceses of Hobart (7.1%) and Adelaide (6.9%). These three dioceses have had consistently high proportions over the last ten years.

Provision of Unpaid Assistance to a Person with a Disability

Another question first included in the 2006 Census asked whether the respondent had provided unpaid assistance to a person with a disability in the two weeks prior to the Census.


The Australian Bureau of Statistics defines such assistance as unpaid help or supervision given to another person to assist them with daily activities because of a disability, a long-term health condition or problems related to old age. A long-term illness is one that has lasted or is likely to last for six months or more. Furthermore, the care could have been provided to family members or other people, but excludes care given through an organisation or club. Care provided by recipients of Carer Allowance or Carer Payment is included as unpaid care.³

According to the ABS, examples of unpaid caring can include, but is not limited to:

- bathing, dressing, toileting and feeding someone
- helping someone to move around
- helping someone to understand or be understood by others
- providing emotional support to someone and helping them to maintain friendships and social activities
- helping with or supervising medication or dressing wounds
- cleaning, laundry, cooking, managing diets and preparing meals
- performing housework, light household repairs or maintenance
- managing household finances
- driving or accompanying someone to appointments and activities.⁴

The question was not applicable to persons aged 0-14.

Figure 2 shows the percentage of Catholics in Australia aged 15 and over who provided unpaid assistance to a person with some form of disability in 2006, 2011 and 2016, as well as a comparison to all Australians in 2016. The proportion of the Catholic population providing assistance has risen at each Census, and in 2016, just over 530,000 Catholics did so. The Catholic proportion (12.5%) is considerably higher than the figures for the Australian population overall, where just over nine per cent assisted people with a disability in 2016.

Table 2 shows the number of Catholics providing unpaid assistance to a person with a disability in every diocese in 2006, 2011 and 2016. In 2016, the Archdiocese of Melbourne had the highest

number of such Catholics (112,218), followed by the Archdiocese of Brisbane (67,683) and the Archdiocese of Sydney (59,060).

Proportionately, in 2016, the Diocese of Sandhurst had the highest percentage of Catholics (14%) who provided assistance, followed by the Diocese of Lismore (13.8%). The dioceses of Maitland-Newcastle, Ballarat and Adelaide had a similarly high proportion (13.6%). Between 2011 and 2016, in every diocese, there was a consistent increase in the proportion of Catholics providing unpaid assistance to a person with a disability.

Sign Languages

A question on the 2016 Census relating to languages other than English spoken at home provided the opportunity for respondents to name specific languages, including sign languages. It is recognised that undercounting of sign languages in the Census is common because of the phrasing of the question and the fact that many sign language users were unaware they could write it on the Census form ⁵. However, the data does provide a limited snapshot of the extent to which hearing impaired Catholics in Australia use sign languages.

Overall, as shown in Table 3, there were around 2,500 Catholics in 2016 who indicated they used a sign language, representing around 0.05 per cent of all Catholics. The vast majority of them use Auslan (88%), the native language of the Australian Deaf Community, while a small proportion use Key Word Sign (2%). The dioceses which had the highest numbers of Catholics using sign languages were those with the highest Catholic populations. Foremost among these, was the Archdiocese of Melbourne, followed closely by the Archdiocese of Brisbane.

Appendix 1 – Social Profile Reports

The following tables and graphs appear on page 12 of each of the *Diocesan Social Profiles* based on the 2016 Australian Census. These have been reproduced here for easy comparison.

The Disability page from the national *Social Profile of the Catholic Community in Australia* has been provided first, followed by pages from each of the social profiles of all Catholic geographical dioceses in Australia. There are two tables that appear in the Disability section on each page.

The first table provides information on the need for assistance with core activities by age, for males and females in different household compositions. The figures in this table for each diocese may not calculate back to the figures in Table 1 of this report, due to calculation irregularities in the original Census data.

The second table presents data on the provision of unpaid assistance by age, for all Catholic males and females. A chart, showing the percentage of Catholics with a core need for assistance, and those providing unpaid assistance by age is also included in each profile.







The 2006 Census was the first to include the variable Core Activity Need for Assistance. The variable was developed to measure the number of people with a profound or severe disability. ABS defines the profound or severe disability population as: "those people needing help or assistance in one or more of the three core activity areas of self-care, mobility and communication, because of a long-term health condition (lasting six months or more), a disability (lasting six months or more), or old age". Most people who need assistance with core activities live either in a family or in a place such as a nursing home, where the care they need is provided. But many live alone. Often people with a disability have fewer opportunities for social interaction. ²


